Aqe

- Darker in color
- Shorter rostrum
- Double dark line on melon
- Male



Betty

- White at tip of rostrum
- White along dorsal fin
- Female



Boomer

- Very light colored lower rostrum
- Male



Casique

- "Lightning bolts" on rostrum
- Long narrow rostrum
- Sloped melon
- Female



Coquina

- Long rostrum
- Sloped melon
- Saddle patch
- Crooked jaw
- Female



Dazzle

- Long rostrum
- Long and lean
- "D" shape in dorsal fin
- Female



Lily

- Dark in color
- Short rostrum
- Big melon
- Large eyes
- Very distinct countershading
- Female



Can you identify all of our dolphins?



Oli

- Rippled trailing edge of his dorsal fin like his mother (Lily)
- Male



Roxy

- Large eyes
- Lower rostrum is longer than top
- Dark markings on melon
- Small white line around eyes
- Female



Shaka

- Thick rostrum
- Freckles
- Large tail flukes
- Zigzag on dorsal
- Female



Sunny

- Very long rostrum
- Freckles
- Notch in peduncle
- Long tongue
- Male



Surge

- Long face (like his father, Sunny)
- Male



Tocoi

- Large pectoral flippers
- Larger melon
- Teeth widely spaced
- One small dark line around eyes
- Dark eyes
- Female



Zac

- Largest dolphin at Marineland
- Darker in color
- Shark-like dorsal fin
- 1/4 Pacific bottlenose dolphin
- Male



Vocabulary:

- **Countershading** = darker coloration on the dolphin's back and lighter on the belly
- **Dorsal Fin** = triangular fin on the dolphin's back
- **Flukes** = tail
- **Leading Edge** = front edge
- **Melon** = forehead
- **Pectoral Flipper** = pair of flippers on the dolphin's sides
- **Rostrum** = mouth
- **Trailing Edge** = back edge
